Over the past 22 years of service at UA, I have seen the faculty, staff, students, and campus grow to new heights and achieve many great things. I started my career in Computer Science at the UA College of Engineering and helped build the largest center on campus, the Center for Advanced Public Safety (CAPS). In 2017, I accepted an opportunity in Management Information Systems within the College of Business in conjunction with a Deputy Director role with the Institute of Data & Analytics (IDA).
